

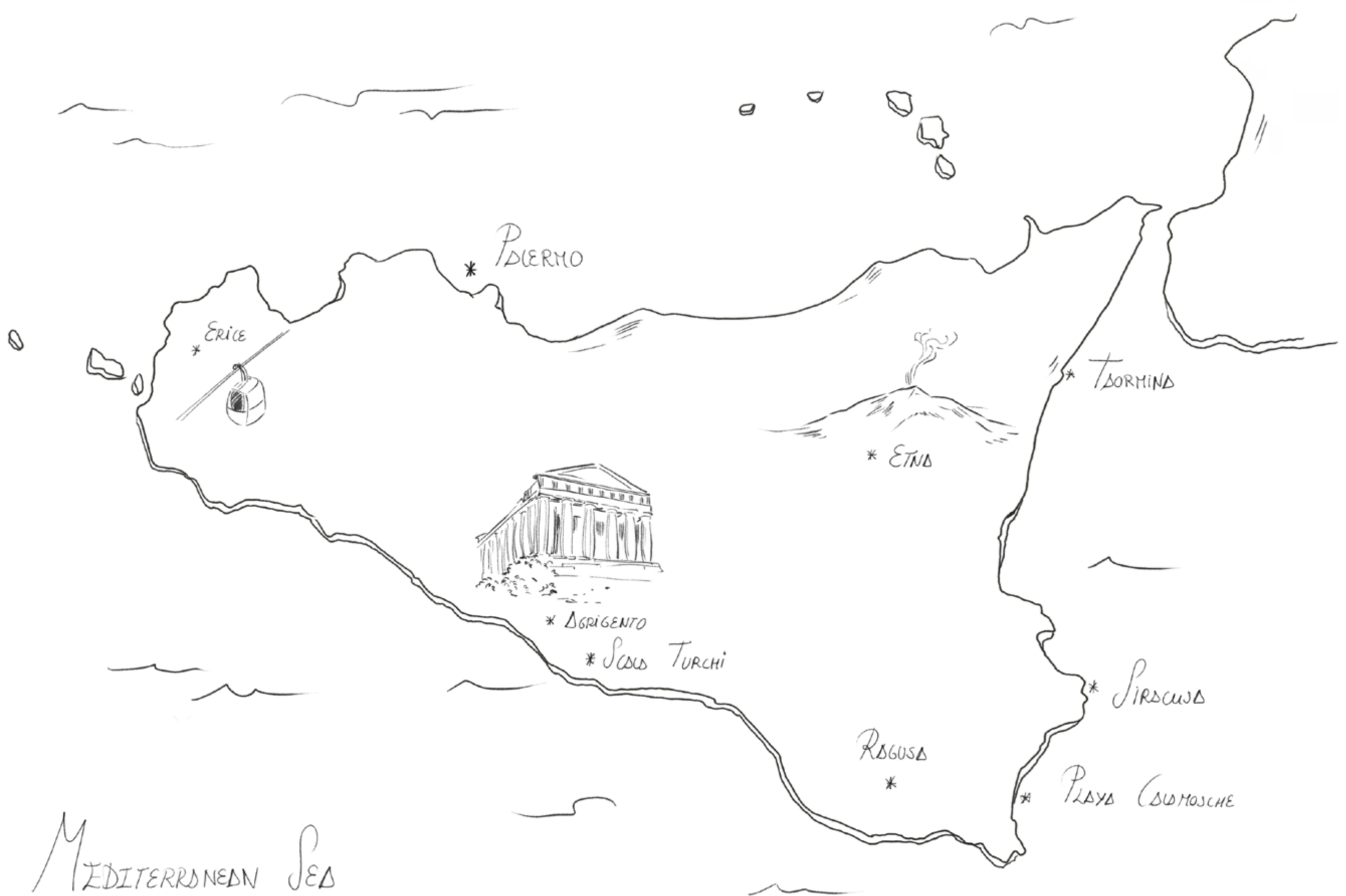
SICILY

TRAVEL GUIDE

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PALERMO

Chaotic, vibrant, and full of history, Palermo is the island's capital. Its streets are bursting with life, and fruit, pistachio, and fresh fish markets.

TAORMINA

Located on the east coast, Taormina sits at a top of a cliff with breathtaking views of the sea and Mount Etna. Don't miss the spectacular view from Villa Ducale!

RAGUSA

Situated in the southeast of the island, Ragusa stretches across a limestone hill between the valleys of cava San Leonardo and cava Sant Domenica.

Must-see:

San Giorgio Church – Its grand staircase of 250 steps and its ornate façade make it truly unique.

MOUNT ETNA

On Sicily's east coast stands the mighty Mount Etna, one of Europe's highest active volcanoes, reaching approximately 3,357 metres (constantly changing due to eruptions).

CALASMOCHE BEACH

Nestled in a natural reserve, this beach is a small paradise surrounded by a semi-desert landscape. Near the parking, check out Oasi della Frutta, a beach bar serving fresh juices and smoothies made from local fruits.

ERICE

A charming medieval village perched on a hill, offering breathtaking views. You can reach it from Trapani by cable car, a fun experience!

SCALA DEI TURCHI

This iconic white limestone cliff is perfect for enjoying the sea and the scenery. To avoid crowds, visit in May or October.

TONNARA DI SCOPELLO

An idyllic spot in the northwest of the island. This former tuna fishery is surrounded by crystal-clear waters, making it a perfect destination to enjoy history, natural beauty, and unforgettable views.

VALLEY OF THE TEMPLES

One of the most impressive vestiges of Sicily's Greek heritage. These ruins, part of the ancient city of Akragas, form the island's most significant archaeological site. Fun fact: its iconic temple inspired the UNESCO logo.
